## ATV/DIRT BIKE POLICY #2-2023

Adopted by Council on September 11, 2023

### ALL TERRAIN VEHICLE (ATV) /DIRT BIKE POLICY

1. No person shall ride, drive or operate an ATV or Dirt Bike in, across, upon or through any boulevard, park, playground, public reserve, parking lot or any private or municipal land in the Village of Richmond.
2. No person shall operate an ATV or Dirt Bike on any street in the Village of Richmond except to go directly from private property within the Village of Richmond to the corporate Village limits or another private property. ATV use for snow removal purposes is permitted.
3. No person shall operate an ATV or Dirt Bike within the Village in such a manner that is dangerous to other persons or property or as to create a nuisance or undue annoyance to residents or other persons in the Village.
4. All personal and public liability will be the responsibility of the owner/operator of the said ATV/Dirt Bike.

ATVs don't require registration, but they do need to be insured with a \$200,000 liability policy before you can ride them in public areas. Contact your local insurance broker to discuss your insurance options.

When riding an ATV in public areas, you must show proof of insurance if asked. Both the owner and the operator of the ATV are liable for any loss, damage or injury incurred when operating the vehicle.

You can only drive an ATV on a public road or street when:

- the road or street is authorized for ATV use by a local bylaw or SGI
- crossing a road or bridge (unless prohibited by local bylaw or SGI)

SGI or the local municipality may prohibit you from driving an ATV on highway ditches and medians, Crown Land, or private or municipal land. If you want to drive an ATV on private land, you'll need to get permission from the land owner first.

#### Licensing requirements

Before you can ride an ATV on public land, you must have a driver's license. If you don't have a driver's license, you must be at least 12 years of age and:

- have completed an ATV training course; or
- be supervised by someone with a driver's license (on their own ATV); or
- be accompanied by someone with a driver's license (on the same ATV you're driving).
